Background and Research Objectives

- ArtsBuild Ontario, in partnership with a number of key funders, sought to conduct a needs assessment survey among small and mid-sized arts organizations in Ontario.
- The survey was intended to provide an up-to-date and comprehensive report on the number and the state of art facilities and the related facility needs of small and mid-sized arts organizations in Ontario.
- The research was designed to obtain the following key information:
 - Facility usage and requirements of Ontario's small and mid-sized arts organizations
 - Ownership structure of existing facilities;
 - Age and life-cycle upgrades / replacement requirements and timelines of existing facilities; and
 - Gaps in the existing cultural infrastructure inventory (geographically and by discipline, current and projected).

ArtsBuild Ontario is grateful to the Department of Canadian Heritage, Ontario Arts Council, Ontario Ministry of Culture and the Ontario Trillium Foundation for financially underwriting this survey.



Methodology

- The following report is based on a survey conducted by Ipsos Reid on behalf of ArtsBuild Ontario among small and mid-sized arts organizations in the province. For the purposes of the survey, "small" and "mid-sized" are defined as organizations with annual operating budgets of less than \$3 million.
- A total of 383 of these organizations were invited and eligible to participate in an online survey designed to measure the number and state of arts facilities and related facility needs of small and mid-sized arts organizations in Ontario.
- Follow up phone calls were made by both Ipsos Reid and ArtsBuild to ensure respondents had received the survey and to encourage participation. The script used by ArtsBuild was reviewed by Ipsos Reid.
- A total of 164 arts organizations participated in the survey (157 English and 7 French). Participating organizations are broken down by discipline, geography and language on the following page.
- The margin of error for the overall survey results, based on a universe of 383 such arts organization, is +/-5.8%, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error will be larger for sub-groups of the surveyed population.
- The sample size and associated margin of error are sufficient to represent the wider population of such organizations through quantitative analysis.
- The overall response rate for the study is 42.8%, which is higher than average for studies of this kind.
- The survey was fielded between July 21 and September 13, 2006.



Methodology

- Where sample sizes are large enough, results have been shown by discipline or other subgroups.
- Organizations from eight arts disciplines were included:
 - 1) Professional Theatre, 2) Dance, 3) Music, 4) Visual and Media Arts, 5) Community Theatre, 6) Dissemination, 7) Multi-disciplinary and 8) Literature organizations.
- For reporting purposes, arts organizations were collapsed into 5 disciplines.¹
- The survey was provided in both official languages.

Executive Summary

The following presents the key findings from the survey.

Capital Project Requirements

- Over half (59%) of planned projects in all categories are expected to be completed within the next 3 years. This amounts to 109 projects. Three-quarters (75%) of arts organizations expect to require at least one capital expenditure within the next 10 years.
- Of those, 72% are currently planning at least one capital project. Building renovations and specialized technical equipment expenditures comprise most planned projects.
- The total cumulative amount of currently planned capital projects as reported by organizations surveyed is just over \$104 million².
- Six in ten (58%) organizations are planning a specialized technical equipment expenditure including lighting, sound, dance floor and 52% are planning a building renovation, upgrade or major repair. Nearly as many (45%) are planning systems upgrades, such as electrical, HVAC or safety upgrades. Fewer organizations are planning for acquisition of building or land (32%) or new building construction (25%)
- 97% of organizations planning a project indicated they would be very likely to apply for a capital grants program geared to the needs of small and mid-sized arts organizations if such a program existed.

Gaps in Existing Cultural Infrastructure

- Seven in ten (69%) of the organizations surveyed report insufficient access to at least one type of required facility. There is a lack of access to facilities to meet the current needs of small and mid-sized arts organizations.
- Storage and service area facilities are in greatest need. Half (45%) of organizations report a lack of access to storage and service area facilities. One-third report a lack of rehearsal / production facilities (39%) and the same proportion lack public presentation facilities (34%).

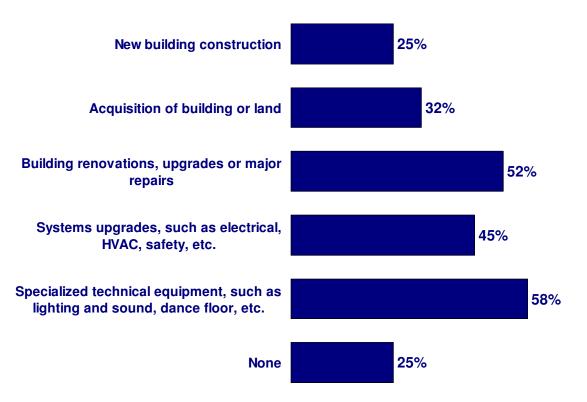


Type of capital expenditures required in the next 10 years

Three-quarters (75%) of arts organizations expect to require at least one capital expenditure for the following types of requirements. Specialized technical equipment including lighting, sound, dance floor and/or building renovations, upgrades or major repairs, and systems upgrades are the main needs.

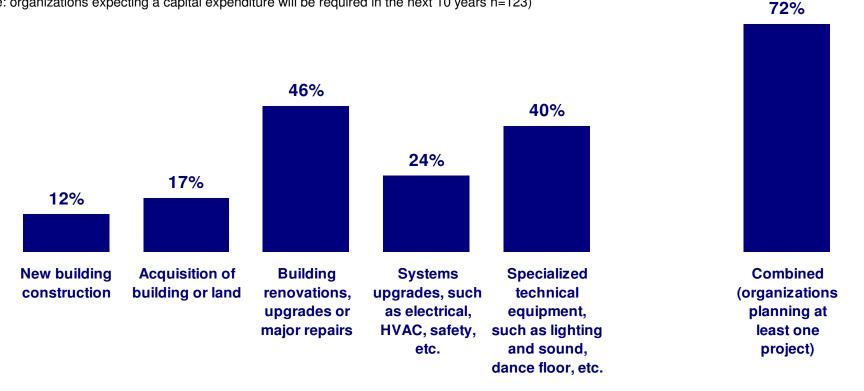


Type of capital projects currently being planned

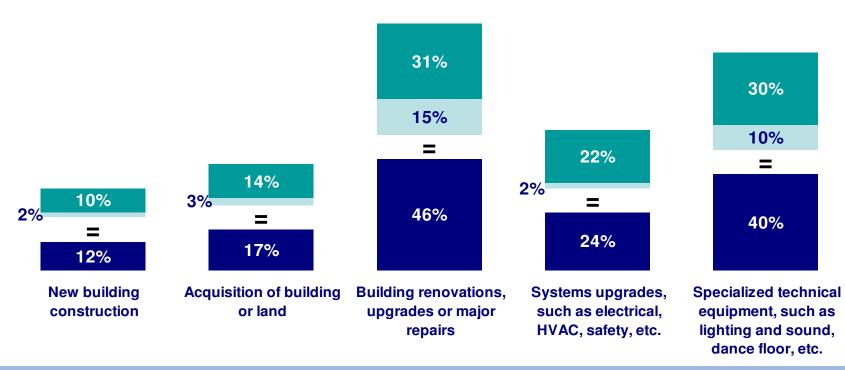
Percentage of currently planned projects with professional quotes plus those based on estimated costs

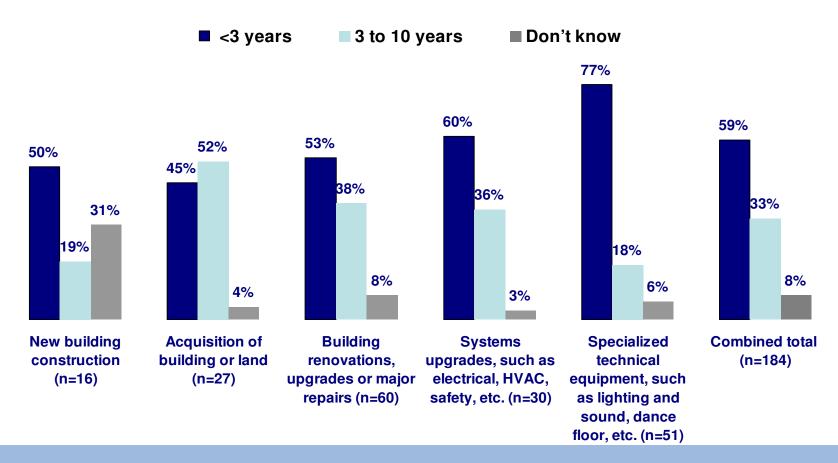


Expected timeline for completion of projects

Gaps in the existing cultural infrastructure inventory

- Seven in ten (69%) of the organizations surveyed report insufficient access to at least one type of required facility.
- Storage and service area facilities⁴ are in greatest need. Half (45%) of organizations report a lack of access to storage and service area facilities. One-third report a lack of rehearsal / production facilities (39%) and the same proportion lack public presentation facilities (34%).

⁴ Storage and service area includes all "behind the scenes" spaces such as storage for artwork, sets and costumes, plus dressing rooms and wings in theatres.

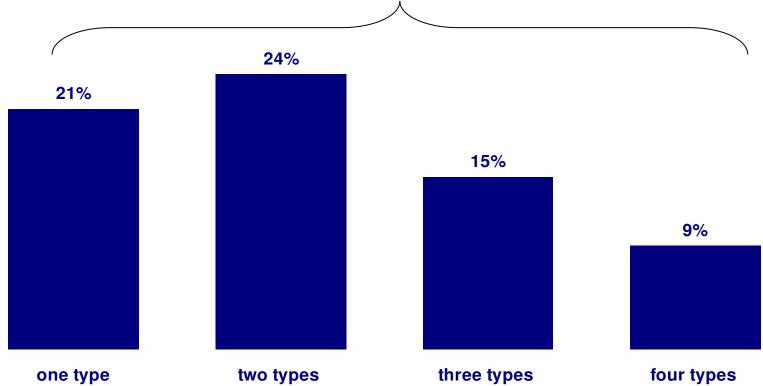


Overall Access to Facilities

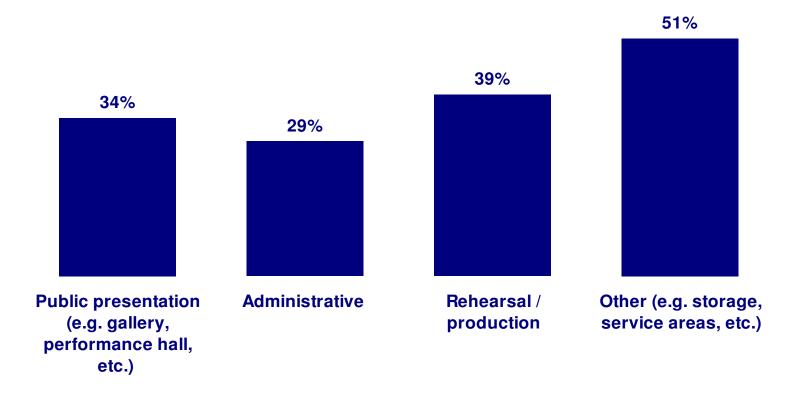


Type of Facilities in Need

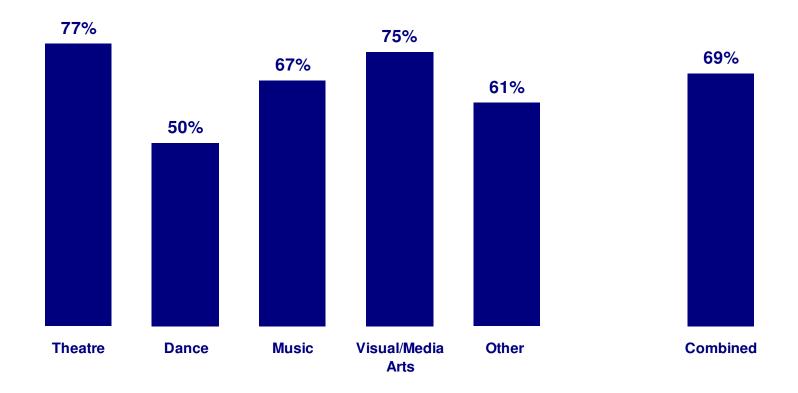


Disciplines Most In Need

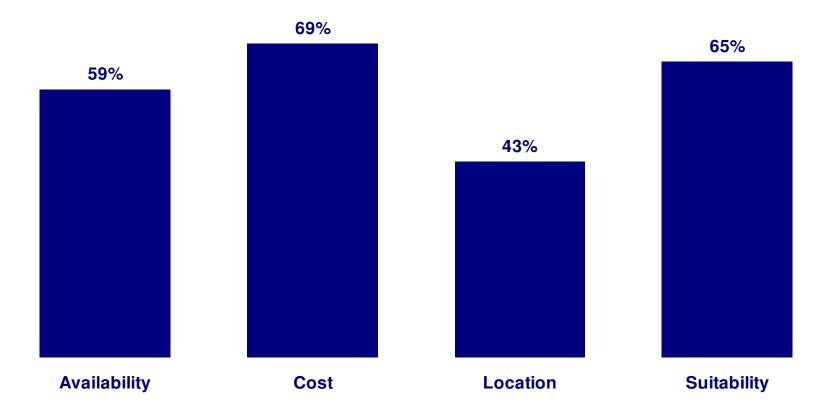


Main reasons for insufficient access to facilities

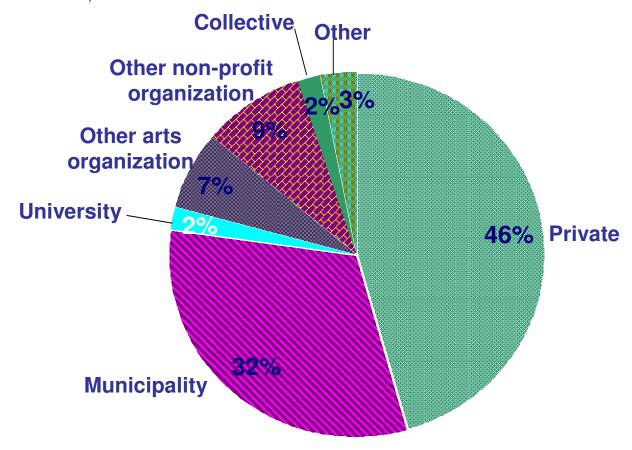


Owners of leased facilities

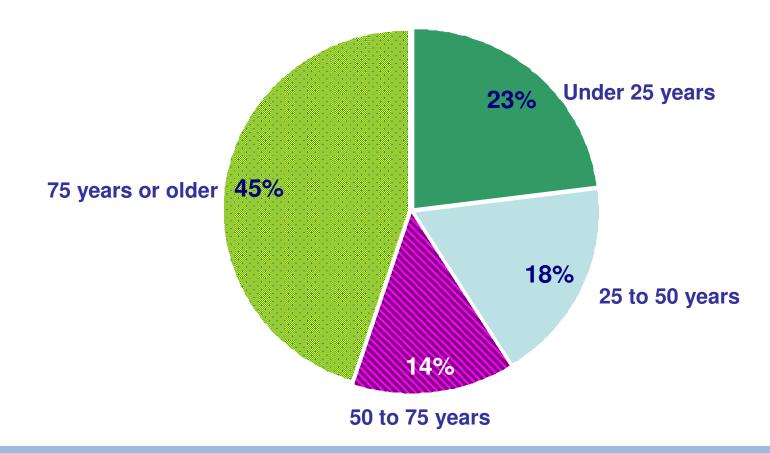


Age of owned facilities and leased facilities

% of owned or leased facilities...

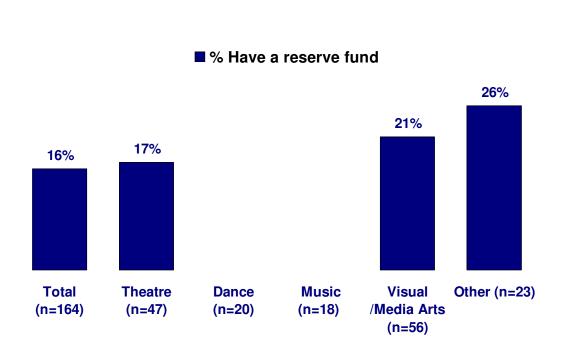

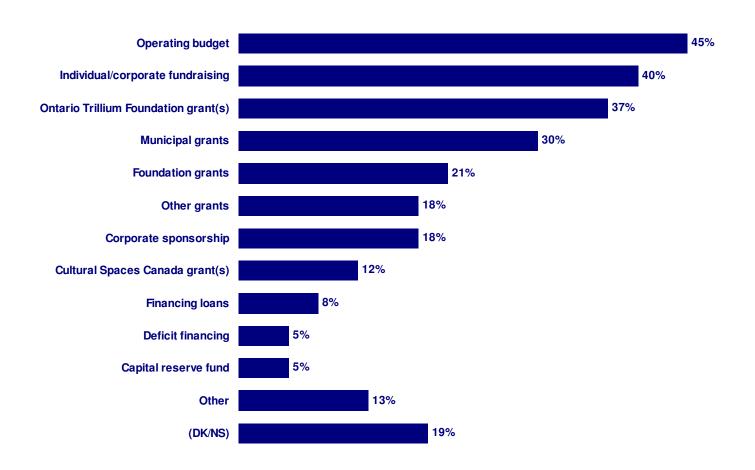

Organizations most frequently indicate using their operating budget, fundraising, Ontario Trillium Foundation grants or municipal grants for capital expenditures made within the last 5 years.





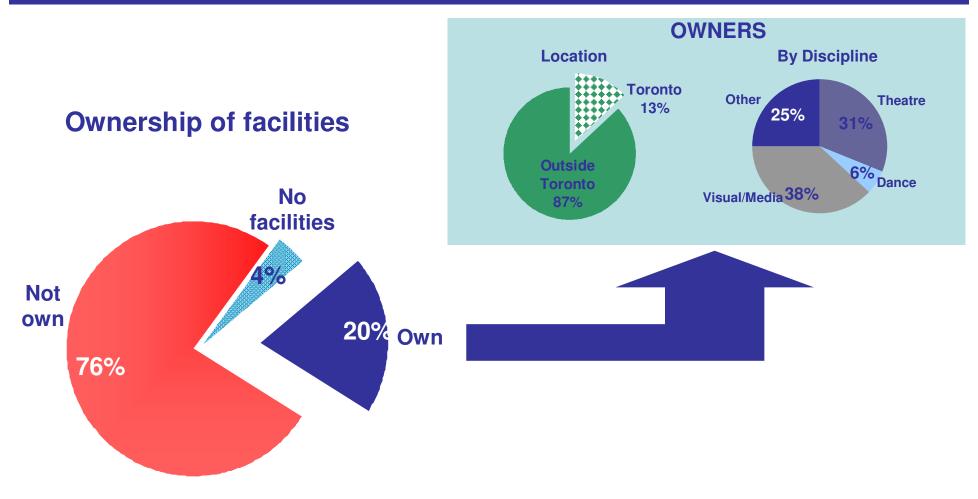
Organization profile data

- In 2004/2005, the 164 organizations surveyed reportedly used a total of 485 facilities
- Since a number of these facilities are used by more than one organization, survey respondents were required to provide the address of each facility they use. In order to keep the survey to a realistic length and to avoid respondent fatigue, organizations were required to list the addresses of up to 9 facilities, even if they use more than 9 facilities. This included up to 3 owned, up to 3 leased and up to 3 rented facilities. Excluding duplication between organizations (eg. two organizations rented the same facility last year), 254 unique facilities were used in 2004/2005. This figure was calculated by first removing duplication within each ownership categories (n=280) than removing duplication across ownership categories e.g. if one organization owns the building and another organization leases space in it, the facility is only counted once).
- Total number of owned facilities: 37 (42 reported, 40 addresses given, 37 unique owned facilities)
- Total number of leased facilities: 94 (128 reported, 117 addresses given, 94 unique leased facilities)
- Total number of rented facilities: 149 (315 reported, 207 addresses given, 149 unique rented facilities)
- One-quarter (28%) of reported facilities are located inside a designated heritage building.
- Ownership is significantly higher outside of Toronto.
- Only 6% of dance organizations and none of the music organization reported owning any of the facilities the use.

Ownership of Facilities

Only 2 in 10 organizations own any of their facilities. Ownership is significantly higher outside of Toronto. Only 6% of dance organizations and none of the music organization reported owning any of the facilities they use.

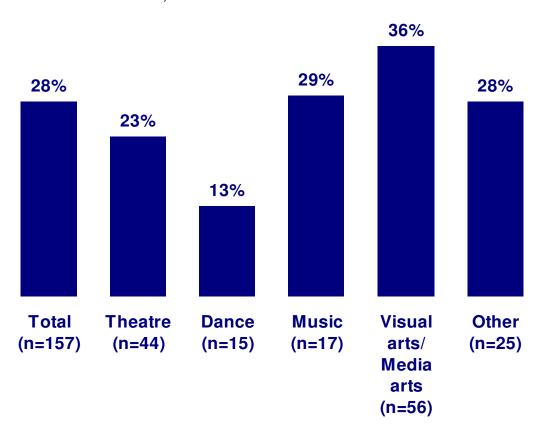


Incidence of facilities designated as a heritage building

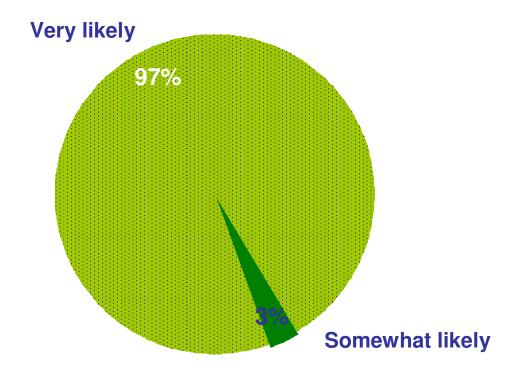


Likelihood to apply for funding from a new capital grants program

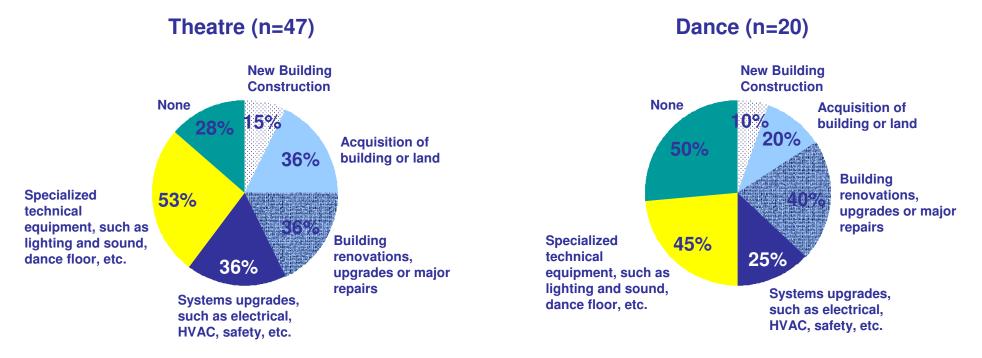

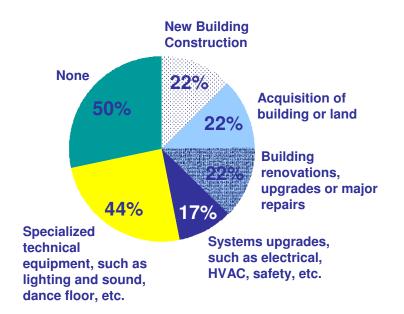


Required Capital Expenditure By Discipline

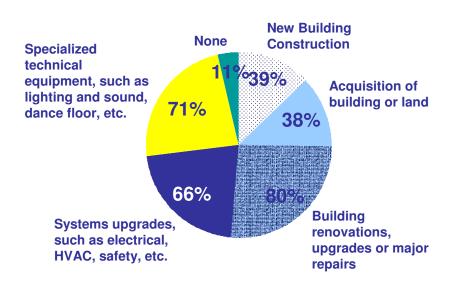
% of organizations who report expected capital expenditures within the next 10 years

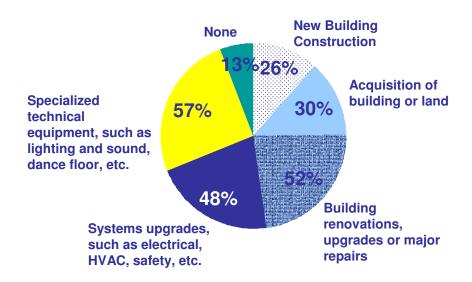


Required Capital Expenditure By Discipline

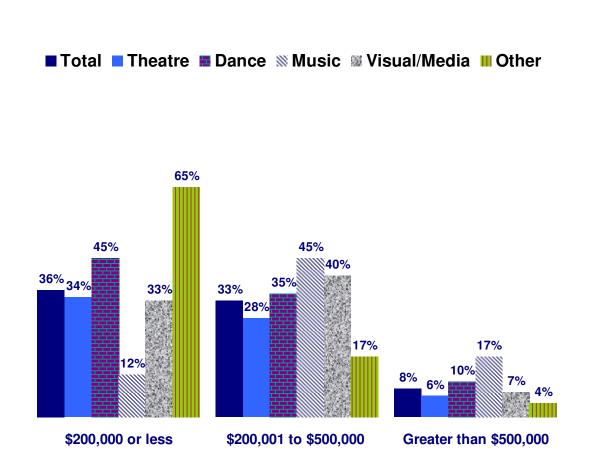

Half of organizations surveyed report revenues of \$214K or less for the 2004/2005 year.



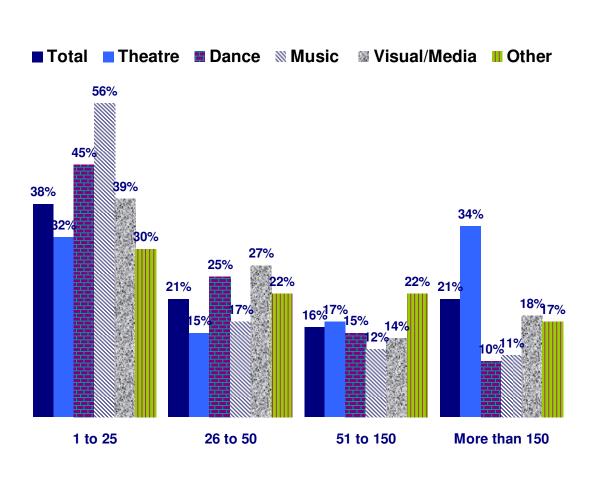

Type of Facilities Needed by Discipline

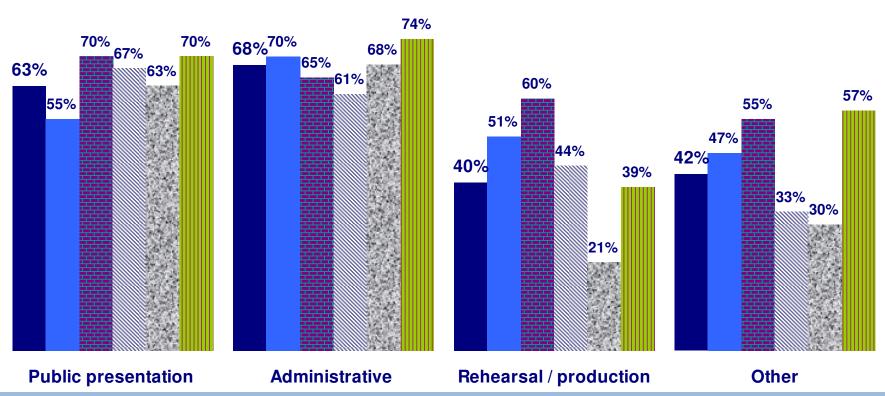
While most organizations have access to public presentation and administrative space, there is less access to rehearsal/production and other space (eg. storage or service area). Organizations report the least access to rehearsal or production or "other" space. Only 4 in 10 indicate sufficient access to this type of space. This is particularly an issue for visual/media arts organization.

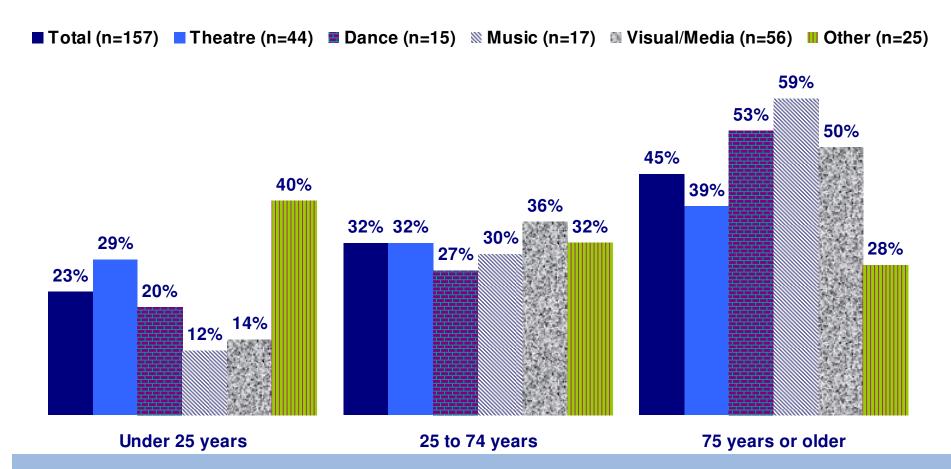




Age of owned facilities and leased facilities by Discipline

Summary of facility ownership, leasing and rental

Organizations outside of Toronto are more likely to own a facility – 88% of owned facilities are outside of Toronto versus 12% in Toronto. 60% of rented facilities are in Toronto versus 41% outside of Toronto.

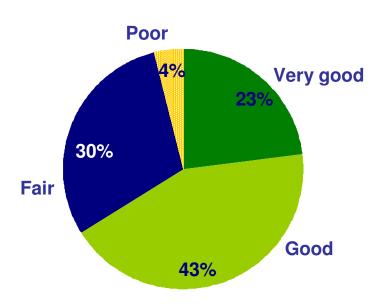


Current State or Condition of Facilities By Geography

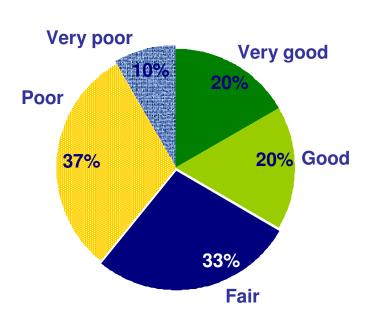

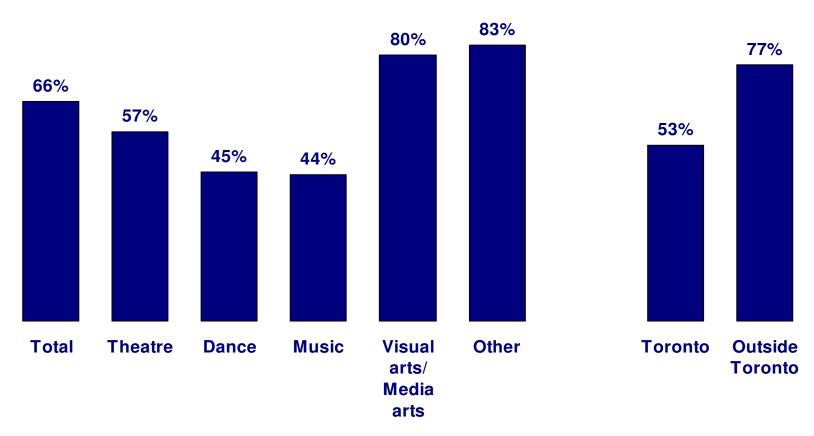

% who use a multi-use facility



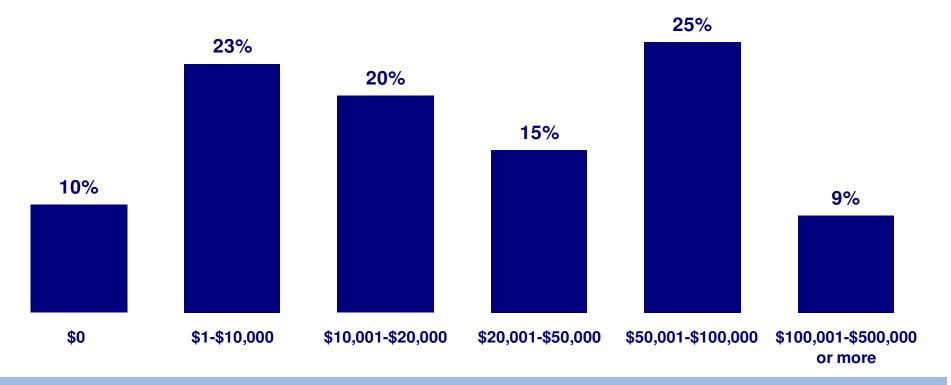

Total repair and upkeep on owned facilities in 2004/2005

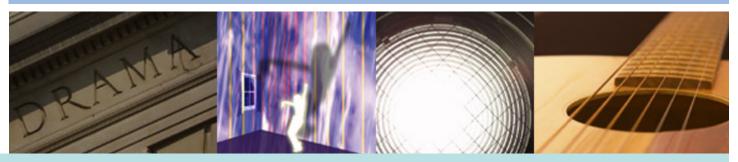
